

The Elks organization cares for the future of our young people. There are several scholarship opportunities available through the Elks at the National, State, and Local levels.

For example:

Elks National Foundation – Most Valuable Student contest will award 500 four-year scholarships to the highest-rated applicants in the 2024 competition. (Additional benefit to applying to this scholarship is it also puts you in the running for a Washington State Elks Scholarship and for our Puyallup Elks: Floyd Dawson Scholarship.)

Application deadline: November 13, 2023

<u>Legacy Awards</u> – This scholarship is open to any child or grandchild of a living Elk who is still active in the organization.

Application deadline: February 5, 2024.

<u>WSEA Vocational Grant</u> – a Washington State Elks Scholarship. It is a Grant for graduating high school seniors who plan to pursue a vocational education.

Due: March 1, 2024

Joseph Darimont Vocational Award – a Washington State Elks Scholarship for any individual 18 years to 50 years of age who is preparing to enter or return to the workforce on a Vocational/Technical path. Award: \$1,000. Due: March 1, 2024

<u>Second Chances</u> – a Washington State Elks Scholarship. For women seeking vocational education in the State of Washington. Scholarship for up to \$1,000 per quarter based on financial need. Renewable up to completion of the course based on a GPA of 3.0.

# **Our Kids: Bridging the Gap**

The Elks Therapy Program has existed since its inception to provide therapy services to children who might otherwise fall through the cracks. These might be related to insurance or transportation or limitations in access.

Elks therapists often find themselves as a part of "Team Suzy", working to find the best solutions for their clients. Frequently these teams may be looking at how to bridge the gap between home and school; two of the places children spend most of their day. The team is helping to analyze the resources available in each location, evaluating what is working well and what improvements can be made to smooth the daily transition between the home and school environments.

A solution could be as simple as a communication journal, or it might be a collaborative approach to ordering equipment such as a wheelchair or activity chair, or a synchronization of one or more communication devices, such that the menus available to the child are the same between devices.

Time spent collaborating is frequently a win for everyone involved. Different members of the team are able to share not only their goals for the child, but the activities that have been successful in working towards that goal. Sometimes it is eye opening to see that what is working in one setting is falling apart in another setting, through no fault of anyone.

Elks Therapists are uniquely poised to help bridge the gaps and can play a valuable role when advocating for Suzy. We have the unique perspective to see the physical layout of the child's environment, the interpersonal relationships, and dynamics of the family, and we are not limited by the "educational relevance" of an issue. We can pick up where another service leaves off. And as outside eyes, we can attempt to articulate why an intervention which may work in one setting, may not be as effective in another.

It is this individualized approach that families appreciate the most and is the gift that is Elks Therapy.

### "Discover Elks"

This year the <u>Washington State Elks Association</u> is making an unprecedented investment in promoting Elks Lodges across Washington State.

Starting September 1st, we're going to have a streaming advertising campaign called Discover Elks that will run for 7 months. These ads will be 15 or 30 seconds and they'll be on streaming video platforms such as Hulu, Paramount plus, and others, so you'll see streaming ads about the Elks in your community.

These ads are going to be targeted to the areas around every single Lodge in our state, so North, East, West, Central and South, everybody will get a chance to see these ads. We even included cities we think a lodge may form.

We themed these ads Discover Elks because we're inviting people in communities across Washington to discover the Elks and what we do for our communities for the very first time. We're also extending an invitation for those who might have heard about us to Re-Discover the Elks, who we are and to consider joining us again.

In addition to our streaming ads we have launched three new platforms to coordinate with this campaign. One is on Facebook under <u>Discover Elks</u>, the second is our <u>YouTube channel for Discover Elks</u>, there you can find our streaming ads as well as additional ad content that we've created specifically for social media.

These videos, as well as our streaming ads, will invite people to visit our third platform, <a href="discoverelks.org">discoverelks.org</a>. This is our brand-new area 8 membership portal that people who see our ads, want to learn more and even join our order, can go to, <a href="discoverelks.org">discoverelks.org</a>, and pull up the state of their choice, any of the area 8 States, and submit a membership interest form. This form will then be taken by our Discover Elks team, get populated into a membership application and forwarded to the appropriate Lodge for further follow-up to bring these individuals into our order. The area 8 States are Alaska, Washington, Oregon, Montana, Idaho, Wyoming, and North and South Dakota.
